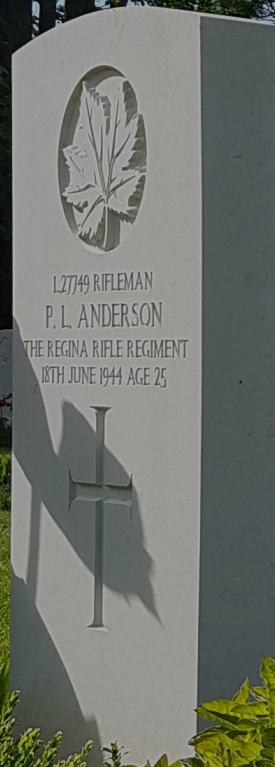

Wednesday April 21

For many of our travelers it is departure day, for the overnight transatlantic flight to France. Some travelers may choose to leave for Europe sooner to extend the start of the trip - let us know if we can quote you on pre-tour accommodations. Guests who have other travels already in progress, or guests from other points of origin including the United Kingdom, the United States and elsewhere, will meet the start of the tour on Day 1 in Paris.

Day 1 - Thursday April 22

In the mid-afternoon all clients can check into the group hotel. In the meantime, luggage is stored in the hotel baggage lock-up. Today you are free to explore Paris, an amazing city of history and monuments. In the late afternoon we gather in the heart of Paris for our Welcome Dinner, to share a glass and set the stage for our special journey. Overnight Paris. [D]

Day 2 - Friday April 23

Depart for the Normandy coast to consider pre D-Day 'Atlantic Wall' defenses including the Longues-sur-Mer coastal gun battery; visit Pegasus Bridge. Overnight Caen. [B,L]

Day 3 - Saturday April 24

Morning walk along the sands of Juno Beach, followed by a tour of the Juno Beach Centre including the German bunkers; see Canada House on the beach at Bernières-sur-Mer; visit the coast at Saint-Aubin-sur-Mer. Overnight Caen. [B,L]

Day 4 - Sunday April 25

Visit British landing zone at Gold Beach and the Mulberry Harbour at Arromanches, including the Musée du Débarquement; Omaha American Landing Beach; Pointe-du-Hoc; La Cambe German War Cemetery. Overnight Caen. [B,L]

Day 5 - Monday April 26

Morning visit to Bény-sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery and Abbey Ardenne, then onward up the coast of France. Overnight Dieppe. [B]

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Day 6 - Tuesday April 27

Tour the Dieppe main beach to consider Operation Jubilee, followed by visits to the beaches at Puys and Pourville; Dieppe Canadian War Cemetery. Overnight Amiens. [B]

Day 7 - Wednesday April 28

Walk the fields of the Battle of the Somme at Beaumont-Hamel Newfoundland Park; visits to the Thiepval Memorial, Lochnagar Crater and the monument at Courcelette. Overnight Lille. [B,L]

Day 8 - Thursday April 29

Vimy Memorial, standing proud on the highest point of Vimy Ridge. In the afternoon we visit the War Graves Commission's factory in Beaurains, where the headstones are engraved with reverence and care. Overnight Lille. [B,L]

Day 9 - Friday April 30

We continue our exploration of the WW1 and the importance of the battles in what has become known as 'Canada's 100 Days.' We also continue our journey along the Trail of the Caribou. Overnight Ieper (Ypres). [B]

Day 10 - Saturday May 1

We will tour the Ypres Salient with visits to Hill 62, the Passchendaele memorial, The Brooding Soldier, Essex Farm, and Tyne Cot Cemetery; free afternoon in Ieper to relax and explore; optional evening attendance at the inspiring Last Post Ceremony. Overnight Ieper (Ypres). [B]

Day 11 - Sunday May 2

Explore the Breskens Pocket with visits to the Leopold Canal, Eede, and the monument at Hoofdplaat on the edge of the Scheldt Estuary. We also walk to an original Bailey Bridge. Overnight Vlissingen/Middelburg area. [B,L]

Day 12 - Monday May 3

Discover the Scheldt Estuary campaign as we make visits in Woensdrecht, Bergen op Zoom, and more. We also visit John Frost Bridge in Arnhem, "A Bridge Too Far," to discuss the now infamous Operation Market-Garden. Overnight Arnhem. [B, L]

Day 13 - Tuesday May 4

It is Remembrance Day in the Netherlands, and we'll attend the annual commemoration service at Holten Canadian War Cemetery in the morning. Lunch at leisure in Zutphen is followed by another short visit along the IJssel River where Canadians are remembered. At 8pm the entire nation stands silent for two minutes. Overnight Arnhem. [B]

Day 14 - Wednesday May 5

In the morning we visit Groesbeek Canadian War Cemetery, and then the brilliant Freedom Museum. Afterward, we gather for our Farewell Lunch. Overnight Amsterdam. [B,L]

Day 15 - Thursday May 6

Enjoy Liberation Day at your leisure exploring one of Europe's great capital cities. Overnight Amsterdam. [B]

Day 16 - Friday May 7

This morning is departure day for those returning home - buffet or box breakfast is included, depending on departure time from the hotel. Some travelers may choose to remain in Europe longer to extend the end of the trip - let us know if we can quote you on post-tour accommodations to enjoy extra time in Amsterdam. [B]

Itinerary is subject to minor change prior to departure. Minor variances are also possible during the actual tour based on the need to adapt to circumstances we may encounter during our travels.

THE TOUR.

Juno Beach

Stand on the very shore where Canadians stormed the beaches on D-Day, June 6, 1944. Learn how the Canadians made it further inland than any other allied force. Your visit includes a guided tour of the beaches and a tour of the Juno Beach Centre. It's a little piece of Canada on the French coast.



Vimy Ridge

The ground that could not be taken and held ... until the Canadians came. For the first time, all four divisions of the Canadian Expeditionary Force will fight together, and their success of April 1917 resonates still to this day. See what many consider the most beautiful of all the war monuments in Europe, a symbol of peace.



Passchendaele

It's been called the ugliest fight of both World Wars. It's October 1917 and the Canadians will suffer gas attacks, infested trenches, misery. And yet they will once again prevail. What was then a barren, muddy landscape is now a quiet, lovely countryside. You'll see where they fought, and where John McCrae wrote his famous poem.



Beaumont-Hamel

Many Canadians don't know the name but Beaumont-Hamel is forever etched into the memory of Newfoundlanders. It was here in July 1916 that a thousand soldiers climbed up out of the trenches and into the gunfire, and were almost completely wiped out. They are the Royal Newfoundland Regiment and their battleground is renowned as one of the best preserved WWI sites in all of France.



THE TRIP.

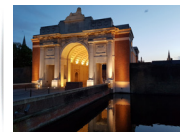
Paris

Enjoy some time unwinding as you absorb Paris in the spring! There's so much to see, including the Eiffel Tower, Notre Dame Cathedral, the Louvre, the Arc de Triomphe, the Champs-Élysées, Les Jardins du Luxembourg, the list goes on!



Ieper (Ypres)

Enjoy a little free time for shopping and a lot of great food, or perhaps a walk along the old city ramparts and cobblestone streets. Here you'll often cross paths with other battlefield tourists from Canada, the United Kingdom and more. The evening Last Post Ceremony is a very special highlight of any visit to Ieper, a tradition that continues since 1928.



Holten

Want to feel great Canadian pride? There can be no better place than Holland in the spring. You'll join with other Canadians, Dutch families, and most especially the local school children, in attending the annual remembrance service at Holten Canadian War Cemetery on May 4th.



Amsterdam

You will round out your fabulous trip with two nights in the beautiful city of Amsterdam. It's 17th century canals are a UNESCO World Heritage Site. You may wish to visit the Rijksmuseum, the House of Anne Frank, or simply sit at a canal-side cafe and enjoy watching the people go by while sipping coffee.
