ITINERARY

Sunday May 23

For many of our travelers it is departure day, for the overnight transatlantic flight to Germany. Some travelers may choose to leave for Europe sooner to extend the start of the trip - let us know if we can assist with pre-tour accommodations. Guests who have other travels already in progress, or guests from other points of origin including the United Kingdom, the United States and elsewhere, will meet the start of the tour on Day 1 in Munich.

Day 1 - Monday May 24

In the mid-afternoon clients can check into the group hotel. In the meantime, luggage is stored in the baggage lock-up. Today you are free to explore Munich, an amazing cosmopolitan city most famous these days for Oktoberfest. In the late afternoon we gather for our Welcome Dinner, to set the stage for our unique journey. Overnight Munich. [D]

Day 2 - Tuesday May 25

We kick off our adventure in Munich, Germany's home of Naziism where in 1923 Hitler attempted to overthrow the Weimar Republic. On the edge of the city we visit Dachau Concentration Camp, one of the first of its kind. We also visit at the famous Hofbräuhaus. Overnight Munich. [B,L]

Day 3 - Wednesday May 26

Today is an optional full-day excursion to Berchtesgaden and The Eagle's Nest. We'll tour Kehlsteinhaus, the famous alpine retreat which served as Hitler's secondary headquarters, and also visit Berchtesgaden with a tour of the local museum and underground network of bunkers. Overnight Munich. [B,L]

Day 4 - Thursday May 27

We hit the road and travel north to Nuremberg, home base of the National Socialists from 1933 onward. We see the remnants of the huge rally grounds, and also take a tour of the courthouse where the Nuremberg Trials were held after the war. Overnight Nuremberg. [B,L]

Day 5 - Friday May 28

We make our way to Czechia and the stunning city of Prague, one of Europe's most beautiful capital cities. We travel back to one of the bleakest periods in this country's history and confront one of the most ruthless Nazi leaders of them all. Overnight Prague. [B,L]

Day 6 - Saturday May 29

Today is an optional morning excursion to the Terezín Memorial. Also known as the Theresienstadt Ghetto, it was used by the Nazis to hide the true nature of their "Final Solution" - the mass annihilation of European Jewry. Returning to Prague, the afternoon is free to explore the city at your leisure. Overnight Prague. [B]

Day 7 - Sunday May 30

We leave Czechia and travel back across the border to the Fatherland, and Dresden. Here we walk the neighbourhoods that bore the heavy burden of the Allied bombing campaign and learn more about its resilient citizens. We carry onward to Leipzig, a deeply rich and cultured city and the home of J.S. Bach. Overnight Leipzig. [B,L]

Day 8 - Monday May 31

Our first stop is the tiny village of Halbe to consider the devastating battle which took place here in February 1945, where roughly 40,000 died. Our journey continues to the town of Zossen and the secret bunker complex, unknown to the Allies until after the war. Overnight Berlin. [B,L]

Day 9 - Tuesday June 1

Winding our way to the north coast, we come upon the seaside village of Peenemünde. This is home to one of the most important and potentially dangerous weapons of the Second World War, the incredible V-2 Rocket facility. We continue our road trip across the border, with one night in beautiful Poland. Overnight Szczecin. [B,L]

Day 10 - Wednesday June 2

Our morning takes us to Kostrzyn, where the Russian Army broke through in their final advance toward Berlin. We will walk to Zhukov's Bunker where he viewed the preparations for the assault across the Oder toward the Seelow Heights. Back into Germany we tour the Seelow Heights and stand where weak and poorly supplied German forces attempted to stem the red tide of nearly 1,000,000 Soviet soldiers. Overnight Berlin. [B,L]

Day 11 - Thursday June 3

We tour various historical locations today in and around Berlin, including a walking tour around Brandenburg Gate, the Reichstag and other points of interest where the 1000-year Reich came to a crashing end. Overnight Berlin. [B,L]

Day 12 - Friday June 4

Today is yours to discover Berlin at your leisure, with your tour guides providing a list of must-see historical points of interest to help you organize your day. In the evening we gather one last time for our Farewell Dinner with new friends. Overnight Berlin. [B,D]

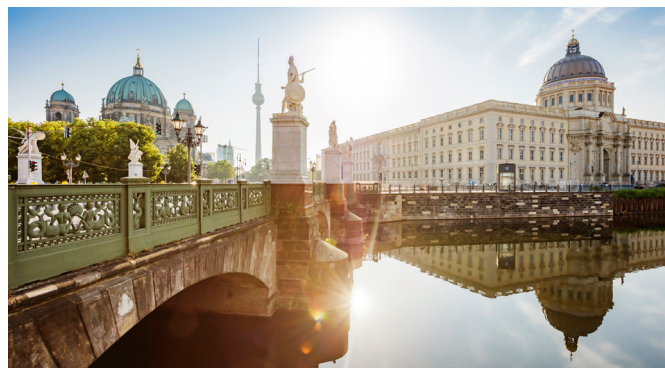
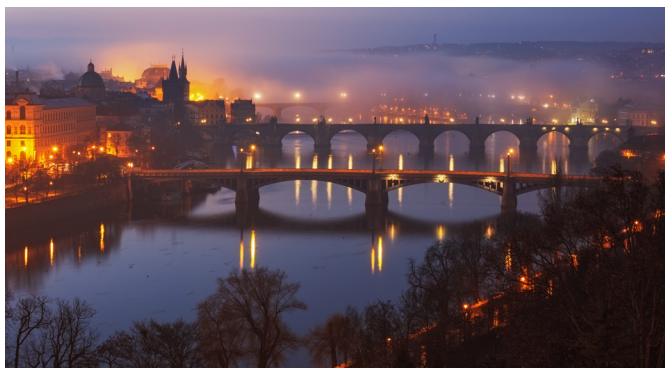
Day 13 - Saturday June 5

TWO AMAZING CAPITAL CITIES.

Prague is widely regarded as one of Europe's most rewarding destinations for historically oriented travelers, owing to the exceptional preservation of its urban fabric and the depth of its cultural legacy. The city's Historic Centre has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site, recognizing its outstanding concentration of architectural and historical landmarks spanning more than a millennium of Central European history.

At the heart of Prague's appeal is its role as a political and cultural capital of the Kingdom of Bohemia and later a major seat of the Holy Roman Empire. This status left an enduring imprint on the cityscape, visible in the coexistence of Romanesque foundations, Gothic cathedrals, Renaissance palaces, and Baroque churches. Prague Castle, one of the largest castle complexes in the world and a UNESCO-listed site, dominates the skyline. Within its walls, visitors encounter St. Vitus Cathedral, a masterwork of Gothic architecture and the ceremonial heart of Czech statehood.

Equally significant is Charles Bridge, a 14th-century stone bridge adorned with Baroque statuary that has connected the Old Town and Lesser Town for centuries. The Old Town Square offers a concentrated historical experience, featuring the Astronomical Clock, which has been measuring time and celestial movement since the early 15th century. Nearby, the Jewish Quarter (Josefov) stands as a poignant testament to Prague's long Jewish history, with preserved synagogues and one of Europe's oldest Jewish cemeteries.

What makes Prague especially worthwhile is not only the individual monuments but the coherence of the historic environment. Unlike many European cities heavily altered by modern development or wartime destruction, Prague retains an authentic sense of continuity. Walking its streets offers a layered encounter with medieval, imperial, and modern European history, making the city an exemplary destination for visitors seeking UNESCO-recognized heritage and a deep historical narrative.

Berlin is a uniquely compelling tourist destination because it offers an unusually visible and intellectually engaging dialogue between its turbulent history—particularly the Second World War—and its dynamic contemporary culture. Few European capitals integrate remembrance, reconstruction, and reinvention as thoroughly or as openly.

The legacy of World War Two is deeply embedded in Berlin's urban landscape. Visitors can explore historically significant sites such as the Reichstag, where the war's end symbolized both destruction and political rebirth, and the Topography of Terror, built on the former headquarters of the Nazi regime. The Memorial to the Murdered Jews of Europe stands at the city's core, providing a stark and contemplative space that underscores Germany's commitment to confronting its past with transparency and responsibility. Museums such as the German Historical Museum and the Jewish Museum Berlin offer rigorous, well-curated narratives that place the war within broader social and political contexts, enhancing understanding rather than glorifying conflict.

Equally compelling is how Berlin's modern identity has grown from this history. The Berlin Wall, once a symbol of division rooted in post-war geopolitics, now exists as preserved fragments and open-air galleries, most notably the East Side Gallery, where contemporary art transforms a relic of oppression into one of expression and unity. The city's neighborhoods—ranging from the historic Mitte to the creative hubs of Kreuzberg and Prenzlauer Berg—reflect a capital that has embraced diversity, innovation, and cultural openness.

Today's Berlin balances solemn remembrance with vibrant modern life. World-class cuisine, a globally influential arts scene, and efficient public infrastructure coexist with memorials and museums that encourage reflection. For tourists, Berlin offers more than sightseeing; it provides a profound opportunity to understand how a city confronts its past while actively shaping a forward-looking, democratic identity.
